**Tehillim 83:18** And let them **know** that You, Whose Name is אֵלֹהִים, **You** alone are the **Most High** over **all** the earth.

**Tehillim 148:13** Let them **praise** the **Name** of אֵלֹהִים, For **His Name** alone is exalted, **His** splendour is above the earth and heavens.

**YeshaYaHu 42:8** "I am אֵלֹהִים, that is **My Name**, and **My esteem** I *do not give* to another, nor **My praise** to *idols*.

**Shemoth 3:15** And **Elohim** said further to Mosheh, "Thus you are to say to the children of Yisra'el, 'אֵלֹהִים **Elohim** of your fathers, the **Elohim** of Abraham, the **Elohim** of Yitshaq, and the **Elohim** of Ya'aqob, **has sent me to you**. This is **My Name forever**, and this is **My Remembrance to all generations**.'

**YeshaYaHu 52:6** "Therefore **My** people **shall know My Name, in that day**, for I am the **One** who is speaking. **See, it is I.**"

**Dani'el 9:19** "O אֵלֹהִים, **hear!** O אֵלֹהִים, **forgive!** O אֵלֹהִים, **listen and act!** **Do not** delay for **Your** own sake, my **Elohim**, for **Your** city and **Your** people are called by **Your Name.**"

**Yehezqel 39:7** "And I **shall** make **My** set-apart **Name known** in the **midst** of **My** people Yisra'el, and not let **My** set-apart **Name** be *profaned* any more. And the *gentiles shall know* that I am אֵלֹהִים, the **Set-apart One** in Yisra'el.

# NOAH WEBSTER 1828 Dictionary

**PROFA'NE**, a. [L. profanus; pro and fanum, a temple.]

1. Irreverent to any thing sacred; applied to persons. A man is profane when he takes the name of Elohim in vain, or treats sacred things with abuse and irreverence.

2. Irreverent; proceeding from a contempt of sacred things, or implying it; as profane words or language; profane swearing.

3. Not sacred; secular; relating to secular things; as profane history.

4. Polluted; not pure.

Nothing is profane that serveth to holy things.

5. Not purified or holy; allowed for common use; as a profane place. **Yehezqël/Ezekiel 42 and 48**

6. Obscene; heathenish; tending to bring reproach on religion; as profane fables. **1 Timothy 4**

**Profane is used chiefly in Scripture in opposition to holy, or qualified ceremonially for sacred services.**

**PROFA'NE**, v.t. To violate any thing sacred, or treat it with abuse, irreverence, obloquy or contempt; as, to profane the name of **Elohim**; to profane the sabbath; to profane the Scriptures or the ordinances of **Elohim**.

1. To pollute; to defile; to apply to temporal uses; to use as base or common. **Yehezqël/Ezekiel 24**

2. To violate. **Mal'aki/Malachi 2**

3. To pollute; to debase. **Wayyiqra/Leviticus 21**

4. To put to a wrong use.

**PROFA'NED**, pp. Violated; treated with irreverence or abuse; applied to common uses; polluted.

**PROFA'NELY**, adv. With irreverence to sacred things or names.

The character of **Elohim** profanely impeached.

1. With abuse or contempt for any thing venerable.

That proud scholar--speaks of Homer too profanely.

**PROFA'NENESS**, n. Irreverence of sacred things; particularly, the use of language which implies irreverence towards **Elohim**; the taking of **Elohim's** name in vain.

Profaneness in men is vulgar and odious; in females, is shocking and detestable.

**PROFA'NER**, n. One who by words or actions, treats sacred things with irreverence; one who uses profane language.

1. A polluter; a defiler; as a profaner of the temple.

**PROFA'NING**, ppr. Violating; treating with irreverence; polluting.

**PROFAN'ITY**, n. Profaneness, which see.
